It should not surprise anyone that insurance companies most often pay for the cheapest form of tooth replacement. More strangely, though, most who cover a bridge are reluctant to pay the same amount for an implant—even though implants are now known to have fewer complications and a better expected lifetime than bridges! This is changing gradually as consumers demand the best treatment for the money.
